Larry will serve as moderator of the corporation with Robin Moyer as secretary, and M. Hannah Bush as treasurer. The Session will serve as trustees for the 2025 year. Those trustees are Robert Christian, Glenn Mader, Larry Mayer, Tracy Mayer, Randy Moyer, Robin Moyer, David Obenschain, Lina Smith, and Sandy Showalter

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

It's Not To Early To Think About Operation Christmas Child

Recently, Randy Moyer the Christian Outreach Committee chairperson, received information about the Samaritan Purse Shoebox initiative, **Operation Christmas Child,** from Kathy Morzark, the local coordinator for Augusta, Bath, Highland, and Rockbridge Counties. Worldwide, there was a record breaking total of shoeboxes collected in 2024. Here in the Shenandoah Valley, 12,579 shoeboxes were packed, which is a 9.8 % increase over the previous year's collection.

One method for increasing the number of shoeboxes for worldwide distribution is to focus on collecting certain items by the entire congregation on a



monthly basis. **Operation Christmas Child** created a poster that can be seen on our Facebook page detailing

monthly items that can be contributed. Then in November, the items collected throughout the year are sorted by age and gender appropriateness and packed in boxes for distribution.

Here are some suggestions:

- January-hats, gloves, scarves, socks
- February-accessories such as hair bows and bands, jewelry, sunglasses
- March-cloth tote bags, craft items, dry watercolor sets, play dough, clay
- April-stuffed animals, cuddly toys, dolls
- May-personal care items, combs, brushes, washcloths, toothbrushes, bath sponges, nail clippers and files
- June-other toys like balls, jump ropes, Legos, mini footballs, yoyos, jack rocks, cube games
- July-musical instruments like kazoos, harmonicas, whistles, tambourines, plastic flutes
- August-school supplies
- September-games, puzzles, card games, cube puzzles

Clerk's Report:

- Session approved the agenda for this meeting.
- Session approved the minutes from the Stated Session Meeting of November 10, 2024
- Session approved by common consent the removal of James B. McGavock and Elton M. Hewitt, Jr. from the church roll following their deaths.
- Session approved by common consent the 2024
 Church Statistical Report submitted by the Clerk.

- Communion was canceled on January 12, 2025, due to inclement weather.

- Financial reports and a proposed budget were emailed to Session members. Reports were accepted by Session. There was discussion on the budget, and it will be reviewed again at the next meeting.

food during their time of grief. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.


