Soap is no longer allowed because of the complications it causes in customs in some nations. Candy, toothpaste, gum used or damaged items, scary or warrelated items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures are not allowed. Chocolate, food, seeds, fruit rolls or other fruit snacks, drink mixes (powdered or liquid), liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins are prohibited as well. Do not pack breakable items such as snow globes, glass containers, or aerosol cans.

News From Nathan

Randy and Donna Moyer are keeping Hebron abreast of Nathan's training and progress as he continues basic Marine training at Parris Island.

August marked Phase 2 of training which began with "Swim Week". That included swimming 50 yards with a ruck and treading water for fifteen minutes in full combat uniform. Week 5 was "Team Week" with intense log drills and strength/endurance runs that became longer and tougher. Bayonet assault courses, pugil stick fighting, martial arts, and a written exam marked Week 6 activities. Week 7 was "Grass Week. This signaled the beginning of phase 3 training where recruits learned about rifle firing positions and practicing trigger pulls. August also included the first Physical Fitness Test and Combat Fitness Test.

Donna reported that the family has received three letters from Nathan at this writing. She has written two letters to him each week. Nathan sends his love to Hebron and misses everyone. He has been going to church there and has been excited about the opportunity. He mentions the heat and wonders if August will end up
