The meeting was called to order at 12:07pm. A quorum was declared present, and the Moderator opened the meeting with prayer.

Clerk's Report:

- Session approved the agenda for this meeting.
- Session approved the minutes from the Stated
 Session Meeting of March 30, 2025, and on April
 5, 2025, and were found to have no exceptions.
- Communion was served on Palm Sunday April 13, 2025.
- Session approved by common consent, the transfer requests from Lorrie Dean, Scott Cline, and Jennifer Sieck.
- Session approved by common consent, with a qualifying letter, to endorse Tara Cahill for a Shenandoah Presbytery Scholarship.

Treasurer's Report:

• Hannah provided a Balance Sheet and a Profit and Loss Budget vs. Actual financial statement year to date. She stated expenses still exceed income. After reviewing the financial statement, a motion was made to move the \$2,421.25 interest from the Fidelity investment to the General Operating Fund. The motion was seconded and passed by Session.

• There was also discussion concerning the renters in the Manse being behind on paying utility bills. Larry and Robert will meet with the renters.

Presbytery Meeting: Next meeting is 9:30 A.M. on May 20, 2025, at Woodstock Presbyterian Church.

Old Business:

- Rev. Dr. Nancy Meehan Yao will visit Hebron Sunday June 1, 2025, to talk with the congregation after *Lemonade on the Linoleum* on searching for a new pastor.
- Larry, chair of the PNC, spoke on the process and forms needed to be submitted to search for a new pastor and the salary requirements.

Committee Reports:

- Christian Outreach Committee: Committee will meet next on May 25, 2025. Next event will be the 4th of July Parade.
- Communication Committee: No report
- Congregational Life Committee: No report
- Finance Committee: Sandy handed out a statement updating the CD investment amounts to date. After reviewing the investments, a motion was made to take the \$30,000 CD and reinvest \$15,000 and move \$15,000 to a money market to be available for expenses, and upon maturity of the CDs, the interest will be placed in the General Operating Fund. The principals will be reinvested. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously by Session.
- Personnel Committee: Sandy handed out a
 job description written by Ellen Desper for
 the treasurer position. Session was asked to
 review and the job description will be discussed at the next meeting.

- Property Committee: The property committee has a prospective renter for the Scout Hut. After discussion on the needs of the renter and needs of the Scout Hut, Session voted unanimously to rent the Scout Hut for \$750/month, plus fuel oil and electric bills. Thanks to Mr. Brubeck who picked up all the branches and twigs, a clean up day is not needed. Due to the plumbing problems in the Men's restroom, Session passed unanimously for the urinal to be removed.
- Worship Committee: Hannah previously emailed to Session members a committee report. The committee sponsored an Organ Recital by Sarah Grove-Humphries on April 13, 2025, and an Easter Breakfast on April 20, 2025. Brantley Whitmore was baptized on Easter Sunday and became a member of Hebron along with his grandmother Karen Highlander reaffirming her faith to become an active member. The cross used in the sanctuary at Easter has become cumbersome and will be replaced with a cross made by Gene Mader. The old cross has been given to the Christian Outreach Committee. Hannah has been updating the Welcome Cards in the pews.

Moderator's Report: Pastor Scoggins will be on vacation the weeks of July 13, August 17, August 24, September 28, November 23, and December 28, 2025.

New Business:

 Session was asked for ideas to mark Sarah's first year as choir director/organist.
