The meeting was called to order at 12:11 P.M. A quorum was declared present, and the Moderator opened the meeting with prayer.

Guest Libby and Claire spoke about Overstory Community School. They provided information on how the school functions, the organization, the future of the school, and their request to partner with Hebron and possible use of the Scout Hut.

#### Clerk's Report:

- Session approved agenda for the meeting.
- Session approved the minutes from the Stated Session Meeting September 21, 2025, Called Meeting October 5, 2025, Congregational Meeting October 19, 2025, and Hebron Corporation Meeting October 19, 2025.
- Allen Turnbull's bike group donated \$250 to Hebron. Session by common consent to put the donation into the Congregational Life Committee Fund.
- Communion was served on World Communion Sunday, October 5, 2025
- A new member, Joel Andrew Smith, joined Hebron on October 5, 2025.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Marsha previously emailed Session members financial reports: Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual, and Transaction List by Date, as September 30, 2025.

After reviewing, Session accepted reports as presented.

<u>Presbytery Meeting</u>: Next meeting is 9:30A.M. Saturday, November 15, 2025, at Covenant Presbyterian

Church in Staunton. Lina Smith may attend this meeting.

#### **Old Business:**

- New contract for treasurer was approved by common consent.
- Lengthy discussion of the Moving Forward Plan on the structure and activities. There are three objectives currently: 1-Door hangers to distribute through the community, 2-Welcome package and visiting neighbors in the community, and 3-Working with the Overstory Community School.

#### **Committee Reports:**

- Christian Outreach Committee: Shoe Box Campaign going well. Celebration of Lights display in Gypsy Hill Park will be set up by November 24, 2025.
- Communication Committee: Joan Wright is resigning as Communication Chair as of December 31, 2025.
- Congregational Life Committee: Christmas covered dish is planned for a Sunday after worship in December.
- Finance Committee: No report.
- Personnel Committee: No report.
- **Property Committee**: The old trees have been removed by the Williams Brothers. Committee has access to a thermal camera to check on energy leaks. Suggestion was made to sell gas stove.
- Worship Committee: Plans in place for Advent and Christmas. Communion is on Christ the King Sunday, November 23, 2025. After worship on the 23rd, we will be decorating the sanctuary.
- **PNC:** The search for a new pastor is not making forward progress. Salary was increased to \$60.000.

<u>Moderator's Report</u>: No report.

#### **New Business:**

• Discussion of how to work and partner with Overstory Community School. A motion was made and seconded to partner with Overstory.

# Report on 207<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Shenandoah Presbytery November 15, 202

On Saturday, November 15, the Presbytery of Shenandoah met at Covenant Presbyterian Church for its fourth and final meeting of 2025. <u>The Moderator</u> called the meeting to order with prayer. After reports from the Stated Clerk and the Associate General Presbyter, a Worship service was conducted. The sound of a roomful of Presbyterian pastors and congregants singing the hymns in full voice was amazing!

<u>Committee on Ministry</u> recommended <u>a 2.5% cost</u> of living adjustment

Board of Pensions PCUSA reported changes in the medical plan and other benefits administrated by the BOP. These changes give congregations and pastors more flexibility but may have a negative effect on the budgets of smaller congregations. Grants are available to assist.

<u>Funds Development PCUSA</u> restructured the Special Offerings, merging several into three main offerings that still support missions focused on disaster and hunger relief, peacemaking, and aiding people at risk. The three remaining are One Great Hour of Sharing (Easter), World Communion, and Christmas Joy.

Committee on Presbytery Administration reported on the "Asking Letters" indicating each church's share of the larger church and the Presbytery budget. The past couple of years, to take some of the burden off the churches, Shen Pres has been asking churches for only a portion of the full budget by subsidizing with funds received when several churches have withdrawn from PCUSA. This year they are asking for the full amount which raises the per person share by about \$20. (The last time Hebron paid its full share was in 2020.)

<u>Committee on Mission and Outreach</u> reported on mission trips that churches have participated in, most recently, to Western North Carolina. They also reported on grants that are available if people or churches want financial assistance.

The meeting of Shenandoah Presbytery adjourned.

The Shenandoah Presbytery Corporation convened its annual meeting to elect officers and present the 2024-25 Annual Report. On June 30, 2025, assets totaled \$16,878,120, up from \$16,446,971 on June 30, 2024. The overall investment portfolio (cash and marketable securities) experienced a net investment income of \$1,646,498. The Corporation pools the savings of the churches, cemeteries, and presbytery committees to receive better rates on its investments. Funds are available quarterly and must be requested in writing prior to the end of the quarter. The corporation's policy: investments must satisfy the divestment criteria prescribed by Mission Responsibility Through Investment (MRTI) of the PCUSA. Simply put: a socially responsible investing policy. (No companies promoting drugs, gambling, social injustice, etc.)
